**Wind turbine makes its mark**

THE landscape of a Suffolk trade park was changed dramatically at the weekend when a 13-metre-high wind turbine was installed.  
The turbine was placed beside the head office for Mediterranean Shipping Company (UK) at Ransomes Europark, Ipswich, using a 25-tonne mobile crane.  
With a rotor blade diameter of 11 metres and a motor rating of 20 kilowatts, the turbine is expected to reduce the carbon footprint of the new building by more than 10% - equivalent to providing the energy required by four average homes each year.  
Robin Green, of Bower Fuller, which installed the turbine, said it was the culmination of a year's work and described it as a "modern landmark".

**Duty evasion: Three jailed**

**CIGARETTE SMUGGLING: Men's sentences amount to 10 years**

THREE men who were involved in a professional cigarette smuggling operation which resulted in the fraudulent evasion of £2million duty have been given jail sentences totalling 10 years.  
The cigarettes were hidden in loads of rice, noodles, safes and electrical goods and were delivered to storage companies in a number of towns including Colchester and Chelmsford, Ipswich Crown Court heard.  
Before the court were Marcin Skulski, 33, of Loughton, Radoslaw Mis, 31, of London, and Rafa Galach, 27, of Woodford Green.  
All three admitted evading duty and Skulski and Mis were each jailed for three-and-a-half years and Galach for three years.  
Jailing the men, Judge David

Goodin said they had been involved in a "professional and wide-ranging" smuggling operation that continued over a significant period of time.  
He accepted the men were not involved at the highest level but said they had each been responsible for a key area of the operation.  
Jennifer Goldring, prosecuting, said that Skulski accepted being involved in the evasion of £875,000 duty, Mis £600,000 and Galach £500,000.  
She said that on five occasions customs officers had intercepted loads and seized five million cigarettes.  
She said officers had also studied delivery records and CCTV footage and had identified other occasions when cigarettes were illegally brought into the country although no seizures were made on those occasions.
